Emergency Drill Successful Nursing Center Performs Mock Emergency Response

In October, Asbury completed a full-scale disaster drill as annually required for skilled nursing facilities per the guidelines of Life Safety (a branch of the Department of Health). We did this in coordination with UPMC Emergency Preparedness and nine other UPMC skilled nursing facilities.

The team was aware that a drill was to take place, but were purposely given minimal information beforehand as not be too prepared for the mock scenario. In the scenario, a portion of the roof had blown off due to a round of severe thunderstorms in the area. The team was tasked to evacuate 18 residents from Asbury and transport them to partnering UPMC Senior Communities campuses.

"The drill allows us to test our Emergency Operations Plan in a low-stress environment and produce best practices to lean on each other, communicate, and do what is best to keep our residents safe," said Joey Boyles, executive director.

UPMC Senior Communities established a Command Center with all 10 facilities and their senior leadership to ensure the proper "mock" transfer of 18 residents from the Asbury campus.

"A huge thank you to Holly Villella, Lisa Osborne, Laura Scales, and all those involved for their coordination and involvement," added Joey.

Fighting Food Insecurity

Food insecurity is a serious matter that affects one in five people in Pittsburgh. According to the city's website, this equates to over 60,000 individuals struggling to have a healthy and adequate food supply.

To help address this issue, Asbury partners with Living Stones, a local organization that works to feed those in need. Living Stones supplies Asbury with aluminum pans that dining staff fill and freeze with leftover food. Volunteers from Living Stones then collect the food and transport it to their freezers for distribution throughout the community.

In addition to this partnership, Asbury collects food for people and pets during the annual Scouting for Food and Chow Wagon campaign in April. Thanks to generous donations from residents, families, and staff, Asbury was able to contribute 585 units of food to this year's campaign.
