Introducing the Ace Lock System

A series of steps have been taken to improve the safety and security of the Asbury Heights campus. In 2022, we upgraded the wandering prevention system to Elpas. An update to the emergency call system was made with the TruView system and new state-of-the-art Geo pendants were issued to Asbury Heights independent living and Carriage Home residents, and to personal care residents. More recently, we further improved the security of all four the skilled nursing communities with the installation of keypads, requiring visitors to enter a code to enter and exit.

Asbury Heights recently activated another new safety feature that allows the Security Office to instantly lock all entrance doors of the seven connected buildings on the Main Campus and to summon assistance from the police and fire departments. This new system is called Ace Lock and is designed to keep external threats from entering the buildings (other than the police/fire force). Ace Lock enables Security to initiate an immediate lock-down to keep any outside threats from entering the buildings. Once the lockdown is initiated, those already inside the building would still be able to exit, when directed.

If an external threat should occur in the vicinity of Asbury Heights, staying indoors provides the most safety. The Ace Lock system will prevent anyone from entering the building. During such a lockdown, opening





the doors to let someone into the building is strictly prohibited (other than when directed by the policy/fire departments).

Lockdowns are impossible to predict. If one should go into effect when you are expecting a visitor, please make every attempt to notify your visitor of the lockdown before they arrive to Asbury. Suspicion is enough to initiate a lockdown.

Acting on a false alarm will not cause harm to the facility, residents, visitors, or staff. Keys and door fobs will not be operational. If a resident, visitor, or staff member is outside when the lockdown begins, they should shelter elsewhere.

Updates from the Security Department will be provide telephones and/or public announcement system until and "all clear" is given from local law enforcement.

The Ace Lock system is not available at Asbury Villas, Asbury Place, the Carriage Homes, and The Embassy. These communities have far fewer doors that lead inside; therefore, residents and staff can readily lock all the doors on the ground level to prevent any bad actors from entering.

Pittsburgh's Plastic Bag Ban

On Saturday, October 14, the plastic bag ban within the City of Pittsburgh limits went into effect. This means that retailers throughout the city are prohibited from distributing plastic carry-out bags to customers.

The ban will eventually go beyond the city limits and apply to all of Allegheny County. When this happens, Asbury Heights, specifically the Asbury Cafe, will be subject to comply.
