Sit Down and STAY a While

As a continuing care community, Asbury Heights is designed to facilitate residents' transitions from independent living homes into personal care apartments and then onto full-time nursing care if and when it's necessary. But the Asbury staff understands the importance of remaining as independent as possible for as long as safely possible, so they introduced STAY (Support and Timely Attention for You) in the fall of 2008. The program is available to any of Asbury's independent-living residents who may require a little extra help in order to continue living on their own.

Since its inception, the program has exceeded expectations for both residents and staff.

The STAY team of nurses now oversees 800 daily pill distributions per month and 50 refills of medication boxes with medication management being the primary reason residents request STAY. In all, STAY nurses have 1300 interactions with patients in a single month with coverage available 12 hours a day, seven days a week, including evenings and weekends. The result is fewer unplanned hospital transfers in 2010 compared to 2009, which shows an increased quality of care.

If the numbers aren't enough to sway you, maybe resident feedback will. **Stacy Mikelonis**, Administrative Director of Quality and Clinical Services, says that while some residents were resistant to STAY, they have come to embrace it as a valuable service that enhances quality of life. And many men and women exploring Asbury Heights for the first time have moved into the community because of the security of the STAY program.

"Through word of mouth and personal experience, residents have come to recognize the value of STAY," says Stacy. "Whether our nurses are administering medications on a daily basis or providing assistance following a hospital stay, residents view STAY as an asset not found elsewhere in the area, and they appreciate the security, which ultimately means fewer negative health outcomes for them."

Due to the success of the program, Stacy's team is in the process of expanding STAY to include educational programs, and in late 2010, plans to launch a Chronic Disease Management Program that will be based on a model designed by the Stanford School of Medicine. Research shows that 100 percent of Asbury's independent living population has some sort of chronic health condition.

Also in the works is a formal evaluation of STAY by students from the University of Pittsburgh Graduate School of Public Health. The team is conducting independent research, some while shadowing STAY nurses, and will release its findings this fall.

Calling Asbury Home

Jeanne Starr has always been an independent woman. At 18 years of age, she moved to Pittsburgh from Butler, attended secretarial school and worked in most every position at the Pittsburgh General Agency of Union Mutual Life Insurance Company. She left the agency after 30 years, and with a partner the Starr/Wiegand Agency. They were in business for 25 years until they both decided to retire and sell the agency. Jeanne lived independently with no immediate desire to move, though having cared for her parents and watching a neighbor struggle, she knew the time could come when she might need assistance with the responsibilities of day-to-day living. As she approached her 70's, she set to work researching and visiting senior living communities, assessing which would best meet her needs and even requesting the opinion of her physician.


"I asked my doctor what he thought about my moving into a senior community," recalls Jeanne. "He said, 'I think you should do it now while you're active and healthy and can create a full life for yourself. But find somewhere with a continuum of care where someone will care for you regardless of your health and abilities.'"

From there, the decision was easy. Asbury met the criteria. "There was a special warmth here at Asbury. During my visits people seemed genuinely happy and went out of their way to say 'hello,'" remembers Jeanne. "I was able to picture myself and my furnishings fitting in, and I can honestly say that in 10 and a half years I've never had an unhappy day here."

Jeanne says that after three of her girlfriends helped to move her into Asbury's independent living apartment, the community quickly became home for her. She was put in touch with a longer-time resident through the Good Neighbor program, which helped her get acquainted in her new surroundings. Today, she enjoys exercising in the campus Fitness Center, playing bridge four nights a week with friends and attending Resident Council meetings where she was President for a time. She utilizes the Health and Wellness Center because of the convenience

and expert care of the doctors, dentists, and nurses. She has even stopped by the rehabilitation department for suggestions on how to tweak her scooter to make it ergonomically correct.

While she lives in an independent apartment on campus, Jeanne enjoys the housekeeping services and occasionally takes advantage of the STAY Program (see STAY, page 1). Early on, she prepared easy breakfasts and/or a quick lunch in her apartment and always had dinner in the Asbury Dining Room. Now she visits the Asbury Way Café for light breakfasts and lunches and continues to enjoy dinner in the dining room, providing her with no worries of having to wash dishes. And she can socialize with friends who she affectionately calls “the lunch bunch.”

Jeanne says, “If you want to be busy, you can be busy all the time at Asbury. There is always something going on here. Some spend their time in the Asbury Mall playing scrabble, visiting the beauty salon or barber shop, or shopping in the Country Store. Others tend to private gardens or utilize the Asbury vans to go on group outings. Everything you need and want is available, and there’s always someone to assist you.”

While being interviewed for this article, Jeanne slipped a piece of paper across the table. It said simply, “to improve the lives of older adults through high-quality, compassionate care.” It’s the mission of Asbury Heights, something Jeanne believes strongly in and supports through regular donations to the Asbury Foundation.

It is through the generosity of others that Asbury is able to live up to its 102-year-old history, its mission, and to be able to offer the many services and amenities that Jeanne touched upon during her interview. Without the support of our community, there would be no Asbury.

Jeanne is a top supporter who champions for the organization daily and has been instrumental in the success of various funding initiatives. With her assistance, Asbury welcomed a new van for residents to utilize for trips to the grocery store, doctors appointments and social outings. She played a role in the renovation of the nursing center in the late 90s, ensured a successful capital campaign and most recently a Centennial Celebration.

Within the last year, Jeanne was instrumental in the Foundation’s new approach to their Frances Hamilton Society. As a long-time society member, she takes great pride to ensure Frances Campbell Hamilton’s vision lives on for the next 100 years. During the 2009 campaign, Jeanne hosted an event to promote the Foundation and the importance of joining the Society, renewing or upgrading current memberships, and promoting the Society to friends and family.

Jeanne has seen the benefits of retirement communities from an early age. “I cared for my aging parents for many years, and was relieved when they said they wanted to move into a retirement community, their safety was of great concern for me,” recalls Jeanne. “Mother was 96 when she died, and Daddy was 101. I know they wouldn’t have lived that long had they continued to live on their own.”

“Some people wait too long to move in, but nature moves you from one stage to another. Asbury eases those transitions, and to me, that’s worth supporting!”

Geriatrics: The

Residents and family members experience first hand the many benefits of Asbury Heights. A variety of housing options, amenities, diverse social activities and more make it one of the premier retirement communities in the area. But it’s the board-certified, fellowship-trained geriatricians who put Asbury heads above neighboring facilities.

“Asbury Heights is the only long-term care facility in the South Hills with three specially trained geriatricians on staff,” says John Zanardelli, President and CEO, Asbury Heights. And because they’re affiliated with an academic resource — UPMC — they’re on top of what’s happening in the medical community and are actively involved with research and teaching activities shaping the specialty.”

David A. Nace, MD, MPH, Asbury’s Medical Director; **Steven M. Handler, MD, MS**; and **Rollin Wright, MD, MH, MPH**, all see patients in the Health and Wellness Center on campus. **Michelle I. Rossi, MD**, who recently completed her term as a member of Asbury’s Board of Directors, frequently brings her area of expertise to board-discussions. All are board-certified, fellowship-trained geriatricians. Geriatric fellows receive two additional years of training specific to seniors following the completion of their residency program. The geriatric fellowship sets them apart from primary care physicians who may care for a large number of elderly patients but are not specially trained.

Like a pediatrician who is taught to care for the specific needs of children, geriatricians are trained to care for the medical, social and psychological needs of seniors. From diagnosis to disease management, the health care goals of a 75 year old are very different than those of a 40 year old.

According to Dr. Wright who is also part of the UPMC Senior Care-Benedum Geriatric Center, geriatrics is a balancing act since patients are often dealing with more than one ailment at a time. It’s about managing multiple medical

conditions while taking into account functionality, dependence and quality of life issues.

“Our patients are physiologically different than younger patients. Caring for an elderly patient with diabetes and a heart condition is much more involved than writing a prescription and asking her to come back in six months,” explains Dr. Wright. “Can she give herself daily insulin injections? How will she tolerate the prescription for her heart disease since its side effects can make you feel as though your blood sugar is low? Does she even want to continue medication for her congestive heart failure? If not, are her advance directives in place? Is she capable of making such decisions?”

Geriatricians undergo years of training to learn to differentiate between the effects of aging and disease. Cognizant of the tendency to overmedicate patients, geriatricians can be better prescribers of medication than the average physician. They're cognitive experts experienced in managing the neurological needs of aging patients and are adept at accessing other disciplines on behalf of patients, working

in multidisciplinary teams and with families and other caregivers.

“It's about open lines of communication across specialties and with the family members to ensure we're meeting the patient's needs as a whole,” says Dr. Wright. “We have access to endless resources, and we know how to access them on behalf of patients and families.”

Asbury Heights is fortunate to have geriatricians at a time when the number of these specialists is dwindling. According to The American Geriatrics Society, “the number of people 65 and older is larger than ever before, and those 85 and older constitute the fastest growing segment of the population.” Currently, there is only one geriatrician for every 2,500 Americans 75 or older. And by 2030, the number is expected to drop to one geriatrician for every 4,254 older Americans.

Several factors contribute to the shrinking number of geriatricians. Reimbursement rates for geriatric services are low, and geriatricians earn less than other physicians in other specialties. And with many doctors facing sky-high debts from medical school loans, income can play an important role in determining what specialty a physician chooses. In addition, the schedule of a geriatrician is less predictable than specialties such as radiology or dermatology.

“Often people don't understand the value of a geriatrician until they or a family member sees one,” explains Dr. Wright. “Our society puts a high value on youth. As that shifts, so will the opinion of geriatricians.”

Embracing Religious Diversity at Asbury Heights

*In April 2009, the Asbury Heights community lost a cherished member of its family when the **Rev. Neal K. Rogers** passed away. Rev. Rogers served as the chaplain and director of Pastoral Care at Asbury for 17 years, nurturing an ecumenical and inclusive spirit on campus.*

Rev. Rogers requested that after his passing, **Dr. Andrew C. Harvey**, a longtime friend and colleague, be appointed chaplain. Though Dr. Harvey had large shoes to fill, he has seamlessly transitioned into his new role, fostering Asbury's spiritual life. He leads a non-denominational worship service each Sunday morning in the Hickman Memorial Chapel where worshipers often spill into the atrium. Those unable to attend often watch and listen to this service on television via Asbury's cable system. Dr. Harvey conducts additional services throughout the week at Asbury Villas, Asbury Place and Spring Lane and offers a weekly bible study in the Hickman Chapel.

Asbury has a large number of Catholic residents and has historically provided a weekly mass and communion service in conjunction with St. Bernard Catholic Church in Mt. Lebanon.

Spiritual life at Asbury extends beyond traditional worship services, though. Dr. Harvey and Fr. Vereb have led residents in observing Hanukkah, Thanksgiving and Ash Wednesday services. During Holy Week this year, rabbis from Temple Emanuel of South Hills made Passover presentations to residents, as well. In the spring, Dr. Harvey and Fr. Vereb celebrated the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity with the **Most Rev. William Winter**, auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, and United Methodist **Bishop George W. Bashore**. The Week of Prayer began in 1964 during the Second Vatican Council and has since spread to include all Christian faiths and denominations.

"While Asbury Heights has its spiritual roots in United Methodism, we seek to meet the spiritual needs of all residents, regardless of their traditions," explains Dr. Harvey. "Religion is deeply personal, but it's uniting and a source of strength and comfort to followers of all faiths."

Perfecting Patient Care

In the Fall of 2008, Asbury Heights announced its participation in the Perfecting Patient Care (PPC) model, part of the Pittsburgh Regional Health Initiative. The goal is to “equip health care organizations with the tools and resources needed to eliminate errors, decrease inefficiency and waste and deliver more perfect patient care.” As part of the PPC approach, Asbury created Operation Diamond, which highlights teams who have made exceptional progress...

WILLOW COMMUNITY COMES CLEAN

Infection control is an ongoing awareness at Asbury Heights. While policies are in place to ensure that employees practice good hand washing techniques, it's not always possible to oversee the practices of residents.

Employees of the Willow Community put what they learned at Perfecting Patient Care training to work in an effort to increase the frequency and efficacy of resident hand washing before and after meals.

Initial observation revealed an 83 percent success rate in resident hand washing prior to mealtime, but nearly a zero percent success rate following meals. During the observation period, staff considered factors such as residents' ability to clean their own hands and the amount of time involved if staff assisted with hand washing. Based on their findings, the Willow team developed a standardized hand-washing plan, which ensures that each resident has clean hands for mealtime, saves employees time and reduces the risk of infection. After only a few months with the new practices in place, hand washing prior to meal time reached 95 percent while hand washing compliance after meals skyrocketed to 85 percent.



This one initiative created awareness about the importance of hand washing not only for the staff, residents and visitors of the Willow Community, but throughout Asbury's campus. The Evergreen and Redwood communities have adopted the process with other areas to follow.

KILOWATT KILLERS

It's no surprise that a campus as large as Asbury uses a vast amount of electricity when it comes to lighting. Between the lighting of outdoor areas, indoor common areas, residences and offices, approximately 4,232,800 kWh were used in 2008, and there were no controls in place to hold or reduce consumption. Costs were on the rise as were the environmental impact. The Kilowatt Killers set out to control usage and contain costs by 10 percent over a five-year period.

After a careful inventory of each building, the team began retrofitting and upgrading lighting

and fixtures. Traditional incandescent bulbs were traded for compact florescent ones, lower wattage ballasts were installed to better regulate the amount of electricity in common areas and less-frequently used areas were outfitted with motion sensors.

With a maintenance schedule in place and regular meetings between members of the Kilowatt Killers, usage fell to just under 4,000,000 kWh in 2009, requests for replacement bulbs dropped by 50% in two years, and costs have dropped two percent each year for the first two years, putting the team on track to meet its overall goal.

MISSION POSSIBLE

In 2008, the Asbury Way Café was losing money. It required a \$20,000 infusion from Asbury to simply stay afloat. At first glance, making up those losses seemed to be Mission Impossible; however, the PPC team — consisting of

The team began evaluating every item that came and went in the Café. No small task considering that items sold had never previously been tracked. From take out boxes to condiments to hamburger patties, everything was reviewed for profitability. The more the team dug, the clearer it became that remedying the situation was Mission Possible.

By restructuring the menu, introducing less expensive packaging options (switching from Styrofoam takeout boxes to paper wraps and bags saves approximately seven cents per item) and updating the pricing structure, which had not been revised since 2007, the PPC team managed to put the Café back on track. In 2009, the shop was ahead by \$8,000, which meant that Asbury was able to focus the \$20,000 elsewhere in the organization. Café profits will be used to renovate the area, particularly the outdated food preparation area. ■

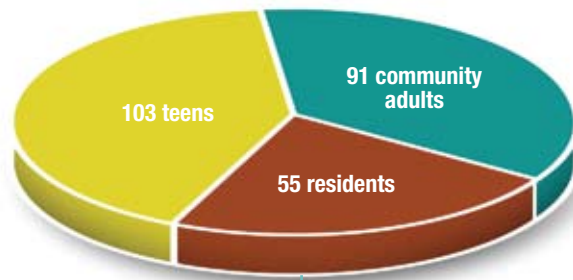

On July 24, 2008, she and a group of other Allegheny County residents were awarded an honorary medal for their service in the Navy. In addition, friends from Peg's Spring Lane residence organized a ceremony for her in the Asbury Mall. Rep. Matt Smith stopped by to present Peg with a second medal and enjoy a celebratory cake with the residents. Perhaps most meaningful to Peg was a Navy scrapbook that Spring Lane caregiver Sandy Saar created.

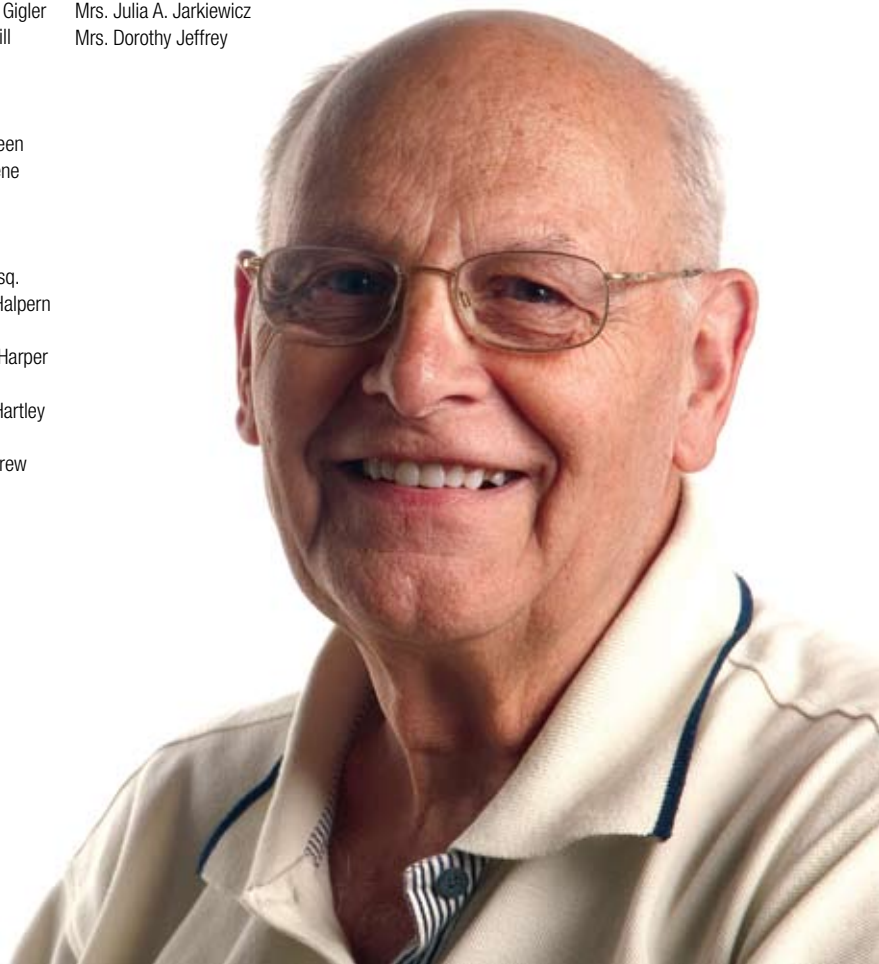

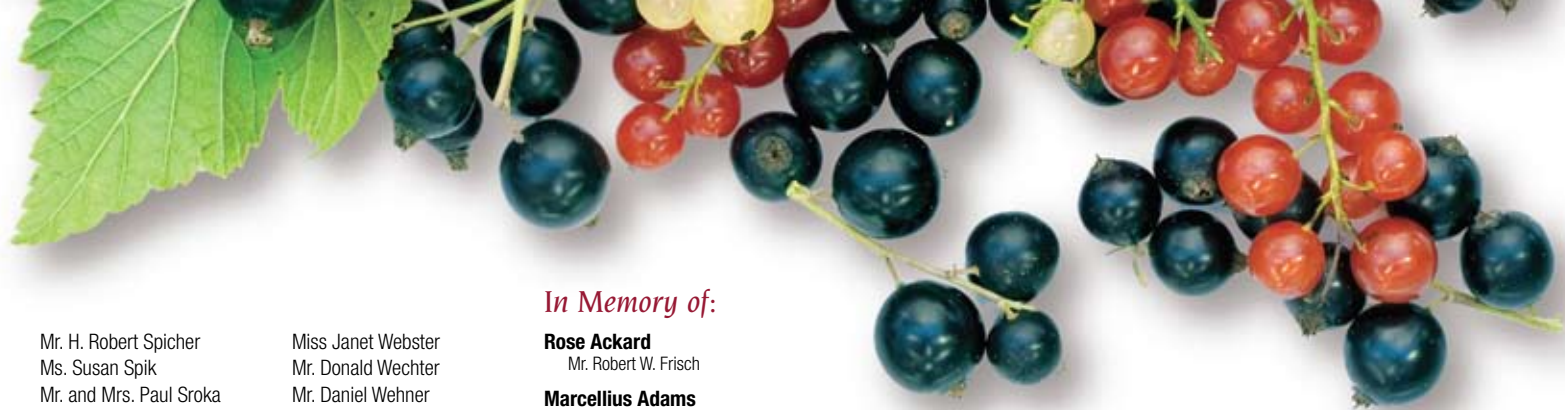
